CHECK LIST

Please note that proof of registration (identity) is required for every horse <u>at time of entry</u>. Copies of papers must be uploaded via the online entry system. Hacks and Hunters do require a minimum of one registration, which may be any relevant breed registration or a Show Horse Council / EA registration etc. Horses in breed classes must submit the relevant registration papers for each different breed (e.g. RPSB, WSPC, ASPA) where classes are entered at the show.

Hendra Virus & Biosecurity

Due to incidences of confirmed Hendra outbreaks in NSW, the RNCAS recommends that all horses competing at the 2016 Royal Canberra Show that reside North of Newcastle be vaccinated against Hendra Virus.

This recommendation may change as further information becomes available. Any changes will be published on the RNCAS website.

Property Identification Code (PIC)

All properties that house horses must now have a Property Identification Code (PIC). The PIC must be included on the Travelling Horse Health Declaration form that must accompany each horse to the show. A PIC can be obtained via an application through the relevant animal health authority in your State.

Travelling Horse Health Declaration forms will be included with acceptance packs and will be available from the website.

Camping sites for the 2016 ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show have dramatically changed due to changes to the physical grounds of EPIC and the needs of the RNCAS. Traditional camping locations may no longer be in existence. New camping sites will be developed to cater for the larger transport rigs. Every endeavour will be made to locate camping sites near where your horses are located.

Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping.

All applications for camping **must** be made at the same time as entering your horses for the 2016 Show.

Camping is only permitted for the period Monday 22 February 2016 from 9.00 am to Sunday 28 February 2016. All campers must leave the grounds by 9.00 am Monday 29 February 2016.

Camping sites will be allocated according to the size of vehicles and camping facilities as specified when applying through the online system. A standard camping site is $10m \times 3m$, however larger sites will be created for larger size vehicles, with fees on a sliding scale. If your vehicle(s) or camping facilities when fully set up exceed $10m \times 3m$ you are required to book extra space, sufficient to accommodate your vehicle(s) and all other equipment as set up. Ensure annexes are included in your measurements.

If your camping equipment exceeds your allocated space you will be moved to another location at the direction of the Camping Staff.

Every vehicle must be applied for when entering online to receive authorised camping stickers. Vehicles must be housed only on the site booked. Any vehicle not authorised will be removed from the camping zones and moved to the offsite parking areas.

Camping site costs – all sites are booked for the period 9 am Monday 22 February to Sunday 28 February 2016 inclusive regardless of length of stay. Fees are payable in advance as per the table.

Electricity

Many vehicles require connection to more than one 10 amp power outlet. If you require more than one 10 amp outlet additional power can be supplied at \$30.00 per 10 amp outlet. Each power outlet paid for will qualify for an authorised tag to attach to your power lead. All leads must be provided by exhibitors and must have a current safety test and tag. Unauthorised leads will be removed.

Note: it is compulsory for ALL leads (even brand new leads) to have been safety tested & tagget

Note: it is compulsory for ALL leads (even brand new leads) to have been safety tested & tagged before they can be used on the grounds.

Camping Rules

At all times campers must abide by the directions given by the Camping Supervisor or their supporting staff. Failure to abide by the Camping Staff directions will lead to removal from the site. With over 5,000 campers each camping group must stay on their allocated space and not impinge on any other camp site or camping group.

When applying for camping via the online system, it is agreed that you have read and understood all camping rules and regulations and will abide by them

How to work out your camping site requirements:

Camping on the grounds is in very high demand. There are restrictions on how many vehicles will be allowed. Exhibitors are entitled to request ONE camping 'site'. A single site can accommodate ONE of the following 3 options:

- 1. One car/ute/4WD and one of the following: caravan or trailer/float or tent OR
- 2. One rigid truck *OR*
- 3. One articulated vehicle combination e.g. one towing vehicle & one horse float OR one complete gooseneck rig

Any <u>additional</u> car/ute/4WD, truck, tent, caravan, trailer or float is considered a 'service' vehicle and may not be included on this single site; exhibitors are to apply for a secondary site large enough to accommodate these extra vehicles/equipment and this site will <u>only</u> be allocated if there is sufficient space. If there is not enough room, extra vehicles can be parked in the public car park just outside Gate 8 at no charge (a pass will be provided). Powered and Non-Powered sites are <u>not</u> available as adjacent sites. You can book a powered camping site as your main camping site and a non-powered site as a secondary site to accommodate extra vehicles, but these sites will not be located together. Measure the vehicles that you wish to have parked on your main camping site. Work out the total space required then consult the table above to work out the fees payable when using the online system. Please note that ALL requested camping sites must be fully paid for at the time of entry.

Camping Rules: Camping is only permitted for the period 9.00 am Monday 22 February 2016 to 9.00 am Monday 29 February 2016.

Camping Refunds:

Exhibitors who withdraw from the Show up to 9.00 am Monday 22 February will be eligible for a refund of any paid camping fees less a booking fee of \$100. Refunds will only be paid if the Horse Section is notified in writing by the deadline specified. Exhibitors who withdraw after these deadlines or do not notify the society in writing by the deadlines, will not be eligible for any refund.

Every endeavour will be made to locate camping sites near where your horses are located. However, the layout of the grounds and stables means that many people will not be able to be camped close to their horses. Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping. All applications for camping must be made at the same time as entering your horses for the 2016 Show.

Vehicles allowed on the camping site will only be the camping equipment as specified for a single site. Every vehicle must be applied for at the time of entry to receive authorised camping stickers. Vehicles must be housed only on the site booked. Any vehicle not authorised will be removed from the camping zones and moved to the public parking areas outside Gate 8.

STABLING BY – LAWS

ALL STABLING ENQUIRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED BY FAX, EMAIL OR MAIL ONLY.

STABLING SUPERVISOR HOURS DURING SHOW:

STRICTLY NO ENTRY BEFORE 9:00 AM ON MONDAY 22 FEBRUARY 2016

- 1. Stabling is limited and not all exhibitors will be offered stabling. Acceptance of entries does not guarantee stabling.
- 2. Stabling allocations are the responsibility of the Stabling Committee and all decisions are final.
- 3. Do not send money for stabling at the time of entry. If stabling is allocated an invoice will be sent with acceptances. Stable invoices must be paid by the due date. Failure to pay will result in automatic cancellation of stables. Showjumping Exhibitors please note payment is required at time of entry due to later closing date.
- 4. Please request stabling where possible only for the days your horses have classes (refer to the schedule for details).
- 5. Environmentally friendly compostable straw bedding for Loose Boxes & Covered Stalls will be provided to all exhibitors that have been allocated stabling on the grounds. Each Loose Box will receive 3 bales of straw for the cost of \$27. Each Covered Stall will receive 2 bales of straw for the cost of \$18.
- 6. Horses that are not allocated a stable at the time of acceptances will automatically go on a stable waiting list.
- 7. Unless an official Withdrawal Notice is received all horses will be assumed to be attending and will remain on the wait lists. An exhibitor who does not attend and does not withdraw will be responsible for all stabling costs as booked.
- 8. Stable check-in time: 6.00 pm on the day of arrival. Check-out time: 5.00 pm on the day of departure. Stable fees are charged for each night the stable is occupied.
- 9. Stables not occupied by the assigned horse by 6.30 pm will be reallocated.
- 10. Stables are allocated to specific horses and are not transferrable. Stables may be used only for housing horses and may not be used for any other purpose.
- 11. Horses may not occupy stables prior to the check in time without the permission of stabling staff.
- 12. All horses must exit by the check-out time and stables must be left clean ready for the next occupant.
- 13. **REFUNDS** Paid stabling fees will be **fully refunded** if the stabling is cancelled in writing, and provided the stabling can be reallocated to a horse on the waiting list. Cancellations will be accepted in writing by fax, mail or email only.
- 14. Horses stabled within a 50 km radius of EPIC will not qualify for stabling.
- 15. Electric fences are not permitted on the grounds.
- 16. Riding class horses that are not entered into at least one other class with sufficient performance will not qualify for stabling.

EXHIBITION BY-LAWS

1. ADVERTISING

No advertising matter of any description or any mark or sign indicating ownership or identity will be permitted on any exhibit being judged or whilst in the arena.

2. AGE OF EXHIBITORS

The age of Junior Riders will be as at the first day of the Show, Wednesday 24 February 2016. All Junior riders must compete in an approved safety helmet.

3. AGGRESSIVE ANIMALS

Aggressive or uncontrollable behaviour by any horse while under the control of the marshalling stewards or while competing in the arena will render the exhibit liable for disqualification from the class or classes concerned and from acceptance for entry at future Shows conducted by the Society.

4. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION

Registration/Horse identification certificates must be shown on request and copies must accompany entries.

5. ANIMAL SECURITY

Where an Exhibitor fails to properly secure any animal and bodily injury or property damage occurs this may constitute a serious breach of insurance policy conditions and prejudice claims settlement.

6. APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

- a. Entries must be made online at www.rncas.org.au, to be accompanied by suitable credit card payment.
- b. Must be lodged with the Secretary prior to the closing date for entries as specified on the schedule cover.
- c. Entries received after the closing date as specified in the schedule, or entries received unaccompanied by the specified entry fees or registration papers will not be accepted.
- d. Fax, email or telephone entries are not acceptable.

7. CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW

It is agreed between the parties that, if in the sole discretion of the Directors or the Chief Executive Officer or some other authorised officer that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the exhibitor shall not pursue the Society for the recoveries of lost income or damages. This complete bar to an action applies to all headings of Law, whether it be Common Law in Contract or Tort or pursuant to any State, Territorial, or Commonwealth Statute Law. It is acknowledged by the exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a Show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such action.

8. CONTROL OF SHOW

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- (i) Reject or cancel any entry any time;
- (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered;
- (iii) Cancel any event or class;
- (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place:
- (v) Alter the conditions of any event;
- (vi) Remove any exhibit from Exhibition Park in Canberra;
- (vii) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any particular entry;
- (viii) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.

The exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Council, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry, the animal, the exhibitor, the conditions of the event, the conduct of the exhibitor, the conducting of the event, the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the exhibits and exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society.

The RNCAS reserves the right to rule at any time that any exhibit, exhibitor or competitor may not compete. This right remains notwithstanding the Society's acceptance of entry, its inclusion in the Society's catalogue or the issue by the Society of an exhibit ticket, number or any other document.

9. CHIEFHORSE STEWARD

The powers of the Society, its Board and its Chief Executive Officer described in these By-Laws have been delegated, in the respect of the Horse Section, to the Chief Horse Steward.

10. ENTER AT OWN RISK

The exhibitor enters entirely at his own risk. In case any exhibit whilst on the Society Showgrounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor or to the personal property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, it's officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits. The exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and it's employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.

11. ENTRY FEES

Entry fees must be paid in full at the time of entry.

12. ENTRY FEE REFUNDS

Entry fees are non-refundable except in the following situations:

- If notice that the exhibitor cannot attend is received in writing on the official withdrawal form no later than 23 December 2015 a refund of all entry fees (with 20% of entry fees, up to a maximum of \$150 to be retained by the Society) will apply.
- There is **no** refund for notification of withdrawal b. after 23 December 2015.
- In the event of exhibits not being accepted entry fees will be refunded, less a \$25 administration fee.

13. ENTRY RESTRICTION

Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any section may be made by Chief Horse Steward.

14. FIRE REGULATIONS

No Smoking in Horse Stalls or Pavilions. Primus stoves or naked lights are not permitted in Horse Stalls or Pavilions.

15. GATE PASSES

Exhibitors will be allocated passes on the following scale:

> 2 Passes 1-3 Horses 4-5 Horses 3 Passes 6 or more Horses 4 Passes

16. GRAND PARADES

- It is a condition of entry into the Royal Canberra Show that every exhibit on the grounds is required to take part in the Grand Parade on the Arena at the times set out in the printed program
- Failure to parade will entail a penalty of \$100 (per exhibit), forfeiture of prize money, awards, and/or non-acceptance at any subsequent Royal Canberra Shows.
- Led exhibits must not be rugged.
- Each exhibit shall wear its exhibit (breastplate) number and riders of horses shall wear formal or hacking attire.
- No ribbons may be worn on exhibits or competitors other than those won during the current Show.

17. JUDGING:

- The society accepts no responsibility if the judging time happens to conflict with one or more classes or events.
- The Judges decision is final. b.
- Champions and Reserve Champions: First prize winners only are eligible for judging. Reserve Champions will be selected from remaining first prize winners and the second prize winner from the class that provided the champion.

18. LIABILITY FOR EXHIBITS

The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

19. MARSHALLING:

- Exhibitors and competitors shall be present in the marshalling yard and be ready to be judged at least 15 minutes prior to the time specified in the timetable for judging of the event.
- Three calls only will be made to the marshalling yard - two warning calls then the final call.
- c. Late competitors and exhibits will only be allowed to enter the arena at the Chief Horse Steward's discretion.
- Ridden Classes Rider only and Led Classes Handler only will be permitted in the Marshalling

20. MEASURING/IDENTIFICATION

ALL horses entered in the 2016 Canberra Royal Show must be presented to be identified by the Official Measurer before competing. When presenting your horse, please have a current copy of relevant breed/registration papers and the breastplate number.

Horses competing in height restricted classes must be measured. Horses will not be measured unless the breastplate number is produced to the Official Measurer. Current Height Certificates may be accepted at the discretion of the Official Measurer.

Any Exhibitor who by himself or any agent:

- directly or indirectly presents a horse which has an identity other than its true identity,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a (b) horse being incorrectly identified,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly measured, or
- presents a horse for measuring when the horse has had any Prohibited Substance administered to it, Is automatically disqualified from exhibiting in any

Class at the Show. The RNCAS may, in its discretion and without

assigning any reason, refuse to measure any horse presented for measuring if, in its opinion, the horse is not in a fit or proper condition to be measured or, in its opinion, any circumstances exist which are likely to lead to the horse being incorrectly measured.

The RNCAS may in its discretion request that a horse be swabbed. Any amendment to the height appearing on the breastplate number may only be made by the Official Measurer.

When measuring a horse, an allowance of up to 1cm or 3/8 inch may be made for shoes.

A horse will be transferred to another Class if it is determined by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the Class for which it has been entered.

Horses presented for measuring at the measuring box must be suitably bitted.

A horse presented for measuring will be allowed a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes in the measuring box before being measured. Should the exhibitor request a further period of time before being measured, one further period of fifteen (15) minutes maximum will be permitted, at a later time.

At the conclusion of this second period of measure the horse's breastplate number will be stamped with the horse's height as determined by the Official Measurer.

- Registration papers of each exhibit must be produced for identification purposes at the time of measuring.
- c. EFA/Hack council certificates may be accepted.

21. MEMBERS ENTRY FEE CONCESSION

Financial members of the RNCAS may claim a 20% reduction on total entry fees where total of entry fees are \$50.00 or more.

22. MISREPRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof as to the bona fides will rest upon the exhibitor.

23. NON EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every horse entered and not withdrawn by Wednesday 24 February 2016 must be exhibited unless a Withdrawal Form signed by the exhibitor or his authorised agent is lodged with the Society before the close of all judging stating that the animal is unable to compete.

24. NUMBERING OF EXHIBITS

- a. Numbers corresponding to the number in the catalogue must be worn by each exhibit (except Showjumping) when appearing before the Judge. Exhibit numbers must be collected from the Ring Secretary's office.
- b. Exhibit numbers, in the form of a breastplate number, must be worn by all exhibits. Numbers are assigned to individual exhibits; different numbers are required for riding class and Pony Club entries. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the correct breastplate number is displayed for a particular class.
- c. Ring stewards will ensure that all exhibits paraded before the judge are eligible to compete in the class are wearing the number shown in the official catalogue and class card. Exhibits not recorded in the official catalogue or class card will not be judged. If name is not listed in catalogue check with Ring Secretary.
- d. Breastplate numbers should be displayed on the horse using a breastplate holder. Pony Club entrants may display the breastplate number pinned to the near side of the saddle blanket.

25. OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR

All persons causing annoyance by;

- Making loud comments, or by other offensive behaviour, on the decisions of Judges, Stewards or other officials; or
- b. The use of swearing or foul language will after being cautioned by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative, be expelled from the ground and if a competitor, be liable for disqualification and forfeiture of any prize money won.

26. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

An exhibit may only be exhibited by an authorised representative of the legal owner(s) or lessee(s).

27. PERFORMANCE

Performance must be given on the entry form for each horse or pony nominated. Nominations in stated classes for horses will not be accepted without recognised performance. List the six (6) BEST performances for each horse. Only one (1) performance per Show and a maximum of one (1) Hack Council/EA affiliated Show performance will be accepted.

A qualifying performance must be achieved at recognised Shows in the 12 months prior to the closing of entries. From the Information contained on the Performance Form the Society will, at its discretion, determine which entries are to be accepted.



28. PONY CLUB CLASSES

(Run under rules of Pony Club Assoc of NSW:)

- a. Proof of age and membership to be made available on request for officials on the day of the event.
- b. Entries will be accepted from approved Pony Clubs affiliated with a Pony Club Association.
- c. Team Events A team shall consist of riders under 25 years of age on the first day of the Show, Wednesday 24 February 2016 unless otherwise specified and shall be restricted to bona fide members of the same Pony Club Association.
- d. A horse must be the property of a member of the Club to which the rider belongs for a period of at least one (1) month prior and one (1) month after the fixture. Such proof to be supplied if called upon, and a breach to carry the penalty of disqualification for twelve (12) months.
- e. Entries must be lodged by the Club Secretary or a responsible official authorised to sign for the Club. NOT INDIVIDUALLY.
- f. Dress Shirt, tie, jodhpurs, approved safety helmet and elastic sided boots.
- g. Money No money prizes will be awarded.

29. PRIZE MONEY

- a. All prize money will be paid by the RNCAS via Electronic Funds Transfer after the conclusion of the Show. Exhibitors must supply a valid BSB and bank account number at the time of submitting their entries via the online entry system.
- b. All exhibitors agree to the RNCAS deducting from their prize money any outstanding balances owing to the RNCAS including but not limited to; stabling costs, membership fees or camp site charges.
- Prize money will be issued to exhibitors by 31 March 2016.
- d. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for classes in which the prize money is sponsored, prize money will be paid by the RNCAS at the amount that is printed in the relevant section of the schedule.
- e. Only 1st Prize money will be paid for classes with five (5) or less competitors competing in the event.

30. PRIZE MONEY AND THE GST

All prize money quoted in the schedule is inclusive of the GST. An official GST/Prize money Declaration form must be completed and returned with all entries.

31. PROTESTS

All protests must be delivered to the Ring Secretary's no later than one (1) hour after the event, after which no protest will be entertained. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50.00, which will be forfeited at the discretion of the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative if they consider the

protest frivolous. Protests will be dealt with by the protest committee as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

32. RED COATS/STEWARDS

During Shows conducted by the RNCAS the failure of an exhibitor to comply with directives issued by a Red Coat escorting Classes into or out of the Arena, or Horse Section (Ring Steward) official shall automatically render the exhibitor involved, liable for disqualification and for non-acceptance of entry at future Royal Canberra Shows.

33. REPLACEMENT OF AN EXHIBIT

The replacement of an exhibit entered in a class, with a substitute exhibit is NOT permitted.

34. SCHEDULE CONDITIONS

Conditions printed in the Schedule relative of class or group of classes will be observed.

35. STALLIONS:

- Stallions entering the arena must be under the control of an experienced handler, rider or driver, 17 years or over, with the exception of Shetland ponies.
- b. Stallions are eligible to compete in harness classes for Driven Stallions only.
- c. All Stallions or Colts 1 year and over competing in led classes MUST be shown in a bit.

36. SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

Riders, drivers and contestants must be suitably attired. A rider, driver or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the Society from competing in any event. Riders, drivers and contestants shall wear at all times when in the Main Arena whether during the Grand Parades or otherwise the same or similar attire as is worn in the judging ring in which they or the animals of which they are in charge were exhibited. *Tennis and gym type shoes are not permitted.* No long boots or gaiters to be worn by Riders under 17 competing in riding classes.

37. TESTS AND SWABBING

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such exhibit for any of the following purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary. A compulsory drug testing levy per horse will apply and is incorporated within class entry fees. It is the intention of these regulations that all animals shall perform on their merits without the aid of drugs which will affect the conduct, performance or appearance of the animal.

An exhibitor shall not administer and shall procure that there shall not be administered to his exhibit any drug or substance herein call "a prohibited drug".



Prohibited drugs are substances originating externally whether or not they are endogenous to the animal and means any performance or behaviour of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillisers and vitamins. The use of antibiotic substances (anti-viral, anti-microbial, anti-parasitic) with the exception of Procaine Penicillin may be permitted.

The Society may at its discretion cause an examination to be made of an exhibit by a Veterinary Officer who in the course of such examination may make by such methods as he may determine such tests of and take such samples from such exhibit as he deems necessary or advisable. The result of such examination shall be reported to the Society.

An exhibit to which, in the opinion of a Veterinary Officer, a prohibited drug has been administered shall not be exhibited without consent of the Society and shall be removed from the Showground forthwith upon notice from the Society.

The Society may in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it disallow or cancel the entry and any award made to the exhibit, without in such case being called upon to give any reason therefore.

The owner or any other person who was in charge of an animal to which a prohibited drug has been administered may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of an animal in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser groups of drugs but analysis for all classes of prohibited substances will be included. The collection of samples inter alia will always involve taking urine and/or blood.

An examination may include an examination for desensitised limbs. Any animal found to have a limb or part of a limb desensitised by any means will be considered to have competed under the influence of a prohibited substances and penalised accordingly.

The owner or his representative may be present during testing (in the case of Showjumping the rider must be present and becomes the authorised representative in accordance with FEI rules) but shall not interfere in any way with the conduct of the test, and will observe the instructions of the veterinary officer on duty. In the absence of the exhibitor and/or owner the Society recognises the rider, and/or handler and/or driver as the authorised agent of the exhibitor.

The Society and any servant or appointee of the Society shall not be liable to the exhibitor, owner or other interested parties, for the death of, or for any injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by an exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any servant, agent or appointee of the Society done or committed in the course of his examination whether due to the negligence of any such servant, agent or appointee or otherwise.

Any exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative to have had administered a drug as defined above, the owner and any person who is in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug defined above, or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society.

38. TIME OF ARRIVAL

All exhibits to be on the ground not later than when specified in the schedule. Entry tickets are forwarded by the Secretary.

39. TRANSFER & RE-CLASSIFICATION

- a. Should a horse be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under the height stipulated for the class in which it has been entered, the owner may lodge an application in writing on the form provided with the Ring Secretary to have the entry transferred to a corresponding horse class in which the exhibit is eligible to compete.
- b. Should a horse cease to be eligible to compete in the class or classes entered for any reason other than height, an application for transfer or reclassification may be made in writing to the Ring Secretary for decision by the Chief Horse Steward or Deputy on duty.
- c. Should the eligibility of a horse to compete in a class in which an entry has been accepted, be questioned prior to the judging of the class the Ring Secretary and/or Ring Steward will so advise the Chief Horse Steward or his Deputy on duty before the judging of the class is completed.
- d. Judges and Ring Stewards are not authorised to consider applications for transfer or reclassification or to make any additions or alterations to information contained on official class cards.

40. VEHICLE PERMIT

Every vehicle entering the Showgrounds will require a vehicle permit. Campers will be issued with vehicle permits as part of their camping fee.

UNAUTHORISED PARKING WILL BE POLICED.

41. CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

Competitors who have multiple entries eligible for championship competitions will be permitted to compete with each of their exhibits. Competitors must present their exhibits with properly attired riders into the ring, and will be permitted to change onto their other horses for their individual workouts. Competitors should advise the Red Coats and Ring Stewards to allow for an orderly display of their exhibits.

42. TRANSPORT

Horse transports will not be permitted to leave Exhibition Park until after the Grand Parade on Saturday and Sunday unless an exemption form has been obtained from the Chief Horse Steward

43. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

No exhibitor shall engage in, or be knowingly involved in, cruelty to any animal. The RNCAS shall be the sole judge of what constitutes animal cruelty, but it may include:

- a. To whip or beat an animal excessively,
- b. To subject an animal to any kind of electric shock,
- To use spurs, or jab a horse with a bit, excessively or persistently,
- d. To remount, or attempt to remount, an exhausted. Lame or injured horse,
- e. To rap a horse,
- f. To hyper sensitise any part of the animal,
- g. To deny an animal adequate food, water or exercise,
- h. To tie a tongue in any manner.

Any case of cruelty must be reported to the Chief Steward.

The Society may, in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it, apply penalties which may include, but are not limited to:

- a. Expulsion from the grounds,
- b. Disqualification and forfeiture of any prizes won,
- c. The levying of a monetary fine,
- d. Disqualification from future Royal Canberra Show

44. CONSENT OF IMAGES

All exhibitors, owners and competitors agree to the RNCAS publishing or reproducing information and images associated with them and with their exhibits at any time, in any medium, for any purpose. This includes live streaming of video, if utilized at the Show.



IMPORTANT CHANGES TO PRIZE MONEY

For the 2016 Show, prize money will <u>not</u> be supplied to exhibitors as cash throughout Show Week.

Once the Show has concluded, prize money will be issued to exhibitors via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) in accordance with the By-Laws. Exhibitors will receive their prize money by 31 March 2016.

Please ensure that you submit valid bank account details when nominating via the online entry system to enable payment of any prize money.

Please ensure that you have read all By-Laws concerning entering the 2016 Show, this includes the new changes made to issuing exhibitor prize money.

STAY SAFE AT THE ActewAGL ROYAL CANBERRA SHOW

The Royal National Capital Agricultural Society is committed in providing a safe environment for all participants and spectators at the ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show.

Equestrian activities have one of the highest risks of serious injury and death compared with other sports, including motorcycle and car racing. Common sense and caution is needed when in the vicinity of horses. Please read the following to ensure a safe visit to the ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show.

Helmets

The wearing of protective headgear has been proved to have a major influence on the reduction of horse related injuries and the use of a properly fitted and fastened helmet when riding horses is compulsory for Junior Riders. Helmets must comply with current Australian Safety standards and are advised to be worn at all times whilst mounted. Helmets should be replaced after any moderate to severe blows or after the recommended replacement time specified in the information provided with the helmet. It is recommended that children involved with horses should wear a helmet at all times, mounted or unmounted.

Footwear

Sturdy boots must always be worn around horses. Human feet are easily crushed by a horse's weight if trodden on. Whilst mounted, riding boots should be smooth soled, heeled and with elastic siding, or be of a specialised long boot design.

Stirrups and other equipment

Stirrups should be 2-3cm wider than the riders boot whilst mounted. A foot caught in a stirrup can result in dragging, and Safety Stirrups should be considered for children and novice riders. All other horse equipment must be of a safe standard and in good working condition.

Always exercise Caution

Caution must always be exercised around horses, especially the hind legs, which are well designed for kicking. Children must not play in the vicinity of horses. Parents and guardians must ensure they are kept well separated. Riders and handlers should exercise extreme caution when riding in the presence of objects that could frighten the horse. Care should also be taken in the warm up area.






BREED CLASSES

Breed Regulations

- 1. BREEDS ARE LISTED IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER
- 2. Performances are not required for Breed classes, but a performance record with your best performances <u>must</u> accompany stabling requests. Stabling is allocated based on a performance system, and is very limited.
- 3. Special conditions applicable to all horses or ponies nominated in registered breed or coloured horse classes.
- 4. Registration number and current Breed Society Membership number <u>must</u> be recorded on online entry system.
- 5. Copies of registration certificates or papers must accompany all entries and must accompany horses to the show.
- 6. Correct registration details **must** be included with entries for all breed classes entered.
- 7. All stallions or colts 1 year and over competing in Led Classes MUST BE SHOWN IN A BIT.
- 8. NOTE: Stabling accommodation WILL NOT be provided for horses under 2 years of age.
- 9. All exhibits must be registered with a relevant Breed Association/Society.

NOTE For Classes with five (5) Exhibitors or less only 1st Prize money will be paid.

The competition will be conducted in four (4) groups as follows:

GROUP A - Sections 1, 2 and 3

Horses entered in Group A are not eligible to compete in Group B or C but may be entered in the Six Bar.

Exhibitors should enter their horses into the appropriate Section (1, 2 or 3) rather than the individual classes. The section fee covers entry to all classes in that section and entry into the Grand Prix and Mini Prix for the horses invited into those classes.

Entrants must nominate each horse for the section that they consider suitable for the horse having regard to its grading, performances and EA performance points and pay the appropriate section entry fee. When entries have closed, the Horse Section Committee will review the nominations for each horse to satisfy itself that the nomination is appropriate. This may result in a horse being moved into a higher or lower section. If either of these things occurs, the entrant will either be required to pay a further amount to satisfy the entry fee or will receive a refund of any amount paid which exceeds the relevant entry fee. The Committee will limit the number of horses for Section 1 to 25 horses, Section 2 to 30 horses and Section 3 to 40 horses based on performances, subject to the Committee's discretion to increase these numbers if it considers it appropriate to do so. Riders will be limited to a maximum of 3 horses in each section. The courses for each section in Group A will be set at the heights indicated below and will be limited to horses that have the EA performance points indicated as at the date of close of entries:

- Section 1: 1.40 to 1.50 metres Horses that have more than 60 points.
- Section 2: 1.30 to 1.40 metres Horses that have between 31 and 60 points inclusive.
- Section 3: 1.20 to 1.30 metres Horses that have 30 points or less.

NB: Horses may be entered in a higher section even if they have lesser points than indicated for that section.

Class 328 Grand Prix – Horses invited into this class will be the top 15 Group A Section 1 horses and the top 5 Group A Section 2 horses as determined by a point score over the two relevant section classes.

Class 329 Mini Prix – Horses invited into this class will be the Group A Section 1 and Section 2 horses not competing in the Grand Prix and the top 5 Group A Section 3 horses as determined by a point score over the three Section 3 classes

Section 2: \$140 Section 3: \$120



GROUP B

For horses to be ridden by a Junior rider which are considered by the Horse Section Committee to be of a standard sufficient to warrant their inclusion. The Committee will limit the number of nominations accepted into Group B to 35 horses based on performances, subject to the Committee's discretion to increase this number if it considers it appropriate to do so. Group B riders will be limited to a maximum of two (2) horses. The rider of any horse may not be substituted after the acceptance date, without the approval of the Committee. This application must be made in writing and include the submission of a doctor's certificate or appropriate documentation. Horses entered in Group B are not eligible to compete in any Group A or C class, nor the Six Bar. Riders are Junior riders from the year of their 12th birthday to the year of their 18th birthday. Nominations for Group B must be made for this group as a whole and not for specific events. Horses not accepted into Group B will have entry fees refunded. Group B classes will be set at between 1.20 and 1.25 metres.

Entry fee for Group B: \$75

GROUP C

This group will consist of three events. Two will be amateur classes limited to amateurs who satisfy the Australian Amateur Ruling. The third will also be an amateur class subject to that Ruling but will also be a qualifying event for the Jumping NSW - 2016 Amateur Showjumper of the Year Series.

Horses entered in an amateur class are not eligible to compete in any Group A or B classes, nor the Six Bar.

The Horse Section Committee will limit the number of nominations accepted into Group C to 35 horses based on performances, subject to the Committee's discretion to increase this number if it considers it appropriate to do so. Group C riders will be limited to a maximum of two (2) horses.

AUSTRALIAN AMATEUR RULING:-

- Amateur Rider classes are classes for riders who:
 - have never competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing;
 - in the past 10 years have not competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying round;
 - have not competed in Section 1 or 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth in the two years prior to the date of close of entries; and
 - have never competed in a 4* 3 day event.
- 2. Athletes must meet the membership requirements as set out in the EA General Regulations.
- Riders may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.
- Amateurs may not compete in an Amateur class if they compete in a class higher than 1.20m at that show.
- Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a horse that will compete in any class higher than 1.20m at that show.
- Organisers may at their discretion limit the number of horses a rider can start in an amateur class.
- The course shall be free-flowing and relatively simple. The first obstacle in the first round should be 10cm lower than the advertised starting height of the competition.
- There will be a maximum rise of 10cm for the jump-off. 8.

ABOUT THE SERIES:
☐ An annual series of shows hosting qualifying events will run throughout the calendar year in NSW and the ACT.
☐ The horse/rider's six best performances will decide the series winner.
☐ Scores will be based on a horse/rider combination.
☐ The first 10 places in each competition will gain points. With the winner of the class gaining 11 points then 2nd 9, 3rd 8 etc
down to 10th 1 point.
□ Class heights in the first round might range between 1.15m to 1.20m depending on the type of arena, and the standard of
the show. Indoor arenas can be first round 1.10m. This should be stated on the show schedules.
□ Participants must meet the criteria of the National Amateur Ruling.
☐ All events will be AM5 Art. 238 2.2 (Jump off classes)
☐ The overall winner of the series will receive a rug and their name of the Jumping NSW Perpetual Trophy which they can
keep for 12 months.
☐ The presentation of the winner will be held at the Summer Showjumping Classic CSI-W in December at The Sydney

Six Bar

Open to horses competing in Group A. The Horse Section Committee may at its discretion limit the number of nominations accepted into the Six Bar in order to ensure that the program can be conducted within the time available. Nominations for the Six Bar must be accompanied by the relevant entry fee. Horses not accepted into the Six Bar will have entry fees refunded.

Entry fee for Six Bar: \$30

Additional rules of competition:

- 1. Any alteration to the Program is at the discretion of the Chief Showjumping Steward and all decisions concerning acceptance of horses into any Group or Section will be final and not reviewable.
- 2. Owners are warned that failure to submit the EA Registration Certificate number of each horse entered in their name in a jumping contest will result in the elimination of their horse or horses from the contest.
- 3. Showjumping prize money will be paid after the completion of the Show by Electronic Funds Transfer.
- 4. Stallions must be stabled in loose boxes and these must be applied for by 4 January 2016. (See 'Note' below)
- 5. Dress Code: During competition and presentation of prizes, competitors must wear a red or black jacket or a hunting jacket, or the uniform of a recognised riding club, white or fawn breeches, black or brown boots or black top boots, a shirt and tie, or shirt and ratcatcher collar. On all other occasions—such as inspecting the course—riders may discard their jackets, but must present in a neat and tidy fashion in breeches, boots, shirt and tie, or ratcatcher. Members of the armed services and the police force may elect to wear service dress. The Ground Jury may permit competitors to wear waterproof coats when appropriate. When the air temperature is above 28° Celsius, riders may compete without a jacket. In this case, competitors must wear a dress shirt and tie. This shirt must have at least short sleeves. Long sleeves must be rolled down and buttoned. The shirt must be tucked into the breeches.
- 6. Alternate Dress Code: During competition and presentation of prizes competitors may compete without a jacket or tie, in a shirt with at least short sleeves, or with long sleeves rolled down and buttoned, or a polo shirt with the neck buttoned, of predominantly one colour (unless provided by sponsors, organising committees or EA). Both shirts and polo shirts must be worn tucked into breeches. White or fawn breeches, black boots or black top boots must be worn. On all occasions riders must be neat and tidy.

ENTRY FEES: As set out per Section, Group or class.

Performances are required for all nominations.

Please make sure you request camping and stabling at the time of entry. Late requests will not be accepted.

No entries will be accepted nor will horse substitutions be allowed after the closing date for entries.

NOTE: Loose boxes will be available for stallions and a number of showjumping horses (priority being given to Group A, Section 1 horses). These must be applied for by 4 January 2016.
