GROUP 7 FINALS -

Competitors can compete in multiple Group Finals unless already qualified for that particular competition. If already qualified, they are eligible to enter for practice only but must inform the organisers before competition begins.

They must be residing in either NSW or the ACT; or be in regular paid employment in NSW or the ACT; or be in full-time education in NSW or the ACT at the time of first competing in any competition year. IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO RESIDE WITHIN THE BOUNDARY OF THE GROUP CONDUCTING THE

To enter the Group Finals separate individual entries are required.

A. PARADERS - F002 QUALIFIER

Class 714

Open to all competitors over 13 years and under 19 on 1st May, 2026.

Finalists to progress to Class F002 at the Royal Easter Show 2026 and will be chosen on the following scale:

1 to 10 entries 3 to compete in finals
11 to 20 entries 6 to compete in finals
21 to 30 entries 9 to compete in finals
over 30 entries 10 to compete in finals

Competitors must lead a Steer or Junior Heifer (not over 20 months).

Competitors in all Paraders' Competitions shall wear a white dust coat with no logo.

Hats are optional whilst parading before a Judge, however caps are not permitted.
