

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

THE COMMITTEE

- Under General Regulation of the RNCAS IN RESPECT TO CONTROL OF any events under its control may REFUSE TO ACCEPT AN ENTRY, EXHIBIT OR EXHIBITOR to any RNCAS event. RNCAS are not required to provide any justification to an Exhibit or an Exhibitor.
- Ownership: The exhibit must be the property of the exhibitor or under a lease agreement at the time of entry.

ENTRIES SUBJECT TO RULES AND REGULATIONS Upon submission of an entry in accordance with Regulation, the Exhibitor agrees to be bound by all rules, regulations and conditions referred to in all Regulation and to ensure that each Agent of the Exhibitor complies with those rules, regulations and conditions. An act or omission of an Agent of an Exhibitor may be deemed by Canberra Royal to be the act or omission of the Exhibitor.

ALTERED ENTRIES Subject to the discretion of Canberra Royal an entry may not be altered after the Closing Date.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES Canberra Royal may restrict the number of entries in any Event.

OWNERSHIP ON JUDGING At the time of judging an Event, each Exhibit entered into that Event by an Exhibitor must be the property of the Exhibitor or be held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at that time. An Exhibit which is not the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at the time of judging will be ineligible for the Event.

ANIMALS AND LIVESTOCK Unless Canberra Royal gives prior written approval, pets, animals or livestock other than Exhibits must not be brought onto or permitted to enter or remain on the Showgrounds.

MUTUAL RECOGNITION Canberra Royal may recognise, act upon and enforce any penalty imposed by a Body on an Exhibit or Exhibitor or Agent at any time.

DECISION

Except as otherwise expressly provided in the Regulations, the decision of a Judge as to the merits of the Exhibit and the Exhibitor or either of them will be final, and the Exhibitor may not protest or appeal the decision.

PRIZES Subject to the Relevant Schedule, a Judge may in his or her opinion: (a) award a second or third prize in place of a first prize; (b) withhold a prize where a prize should not be awarded; (c) where there is a tie for any placing in an Event, award subsequent placings so that the next placing will be the number of Exhibits already placed plus one (for example, if two Exhibits tie for first place, award a third for the next placing); (d) where all the prizes offered in an Event have been awarded and a further Exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize make a reserve number of the further Exhibit; or (e) give commendations where they are deserved. (f) award an Exhibitor more than one prize in any class where more than one entry is permitted PROTESTS AND APPEALS

RESTRICTED TO CLASS Protests and appeals may only be made by Exhibitors with Exhibits in the class to which the protest relates.

PROTEST TO STEWARDS The Exhibitor may protest to the Chief Steward of the relevant section in relation to conduct, judging or any other matter relating to an Event. A protest must be made in accordance with the procedures set out in the Relevant Schedule and be received by the Chief Steward within 24 hours after the conclusion of the applicable Event. APPEAL The Exhibitor may appeal against:

- (a) a decision made by Canberra Royal pursuant to Regulations; or
- (b) a decision of the Chief Steward or if the Chief Steward delegates the person to make the decision to the Assistant Chief Steward, the decision of the Assistant Chief Steward in relation to a protest under Regulation

FORM OF APPEAL

FORFEITURE OF DEPOSIT To be an appeal for the purpose of Regulation

An appeal made by the Exhibitor must be:

- (a) in writing setting out in reasonable detail the grounds for the appeal;
- (b) addressed to: The Chief Executive Officer Canberra Royal Show
- (c) accompanied by a deposit of \$200.00 (or such other amount as is notified from time to time by Canberra Royal for the purpose of this Regulation
- (d) received by the Chief Executive Officer by 5 p.m. on the Business Day which is 10 Business Days after the day on which the decision the subject of the appeal was made.

REVIEW COMMITTEE If an appeal is made in accordance with Regulation the Chief Executive Officer must appoint a Review Committee comprised of three people, being persons who were not part of, and who are independent of, the committee or personnel who made the decision the subject of the appeal. Within a reasonable time after receipt by the Chief Executive Officer of an appeal complying with Regulation.

The Review Committee will meet to consider the appeal. PROCEEDINGS OF THE REVIEW COMMITTEE In considering an appeal, the Review Committee must:

- (a) give due consideration to the grounds of appeal submitted by the Exhibitor, and to any other evidence submitted by the Exhibitor;
- (b) give the Exhibitor an opportunity to make oral representations to the Review Committee; and (c) in its discretion, call for and hear expert opinion.
- (c) NOTIFICATION OF REVIEW COMMITTEE'S DECISION The Chief Executive Officer will notify the Exhibitor of the Review Committee's decision within 48 hours after that decision is notified by the Review Committee to the Chief Executive Officer. The decision of the Review Committee is final, and the Exhibitor will not have any right of appeal in respect of the Review Committee's decision.

TOW AWAY

Any Motor Vehicle or Caravan entering or remaining on the Showgrounds, or any area under Canberra Royal control, in contravention of the Regulations or of any other parking

rules or restrictions, may be removed from the Showgrounds, or any area under Canberra Royal control, by Canberra Royal and stored. Any costs incurred by Canberra Royal pursuant to this Regulation must be paid by the Exhibitor.

REMOVAL FROM SHOWGROUNDS

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where Canberra Royal, its officers, employees, members, contractors or agents removes an Exhibit or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

PRIZES AND GST The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise. The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable. Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST. GST will not apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia. GST will apply:
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST. Where GST applies, the RAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

WARNING: The Exhibitor must complete the Tax Details on the Application for Entry. The RNCAS recommends that the Exhibitor seeks professional advice before completing the Tax Details.

The Cattle Committee is responsible for the wellbeing and organisation of all competitions and has the authority to make any determination upon various matters. The Committee is empowered to make decision or ruling on matters referred to the Committee and exercise any penalties or sanctions in relation to such matters as the Committee deems fit, with the Committee being the final arbiter on any matters arising in relation to the exhibit, exhibitor, competitor or behaviours.

The Society/Cattle committee reserves the absolute discretion to refuse or accept any exhibit, exhibitor or competitor for entry in any event at the Show and to withdraw, disqualify, suspend for any period (including any/all future Shows conducted by the Society) whether before or after the event has been judged.

ABUSIVE OR RUDE BEHAVIOUR

The Royal National Capital Agricultural Society (RNCAS) and the Royal Canberra Cattle Committee take a Zero Tolerance of abusive or rude behaviour towards any exhibitors, Cattle Committee members, Judges, official representatives or volunteers during any events conducted within the grounds of the Royal Canberra Show society. Individuals who breach our policy will be subjected to penalties as specified under our CODE OF CONDUCT AND EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITY

CODE OF CONDUCT AND EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITY

All Exhibitors are responsible for the conduct and actions of themselves their fitters, agents or any persons associated with the preparation and exhibition of their exhibit/s, including adherence to the Code of Conduct and General Regulations.

If an Exhibitor is found to be in breach of the Code of Conduct and/or General Regulation as a result of the actions or conduct of themselves their fitter, agent or any persons associated with the preparation and exhibition of their exhibit/s, the Exhibitor is subject to any penalties/sanctions as deemed by The Royal National Capital Agricultural Society and the Royal Canberra Cattle committee.

- Removal from the grounds of exhibitor or any individuals associated with exhibitor at the earliest opportunity
- Forfeited of any prize money and or judging results
- The committee may also consider or impose other punishment that they consider to be appropriate for any offence

ALCOHOL

Drinking of alcohol on the grounds is only permitted in licensed designated areas. No other alcohol is permitted on the show grounds.

CONSENT OF IMAGES

All Exhibitors, owners and competitors agree to the RNCAS publishing or reproducing information and images associated with them and with their Exhibits at any time, in any medium, for any purpose. This includes live streaming of video, if utilized at the Show.

ANIMAL HEALTH

All Exhibitors are required to complete the National Cattle Health Declaration (V: 16/04/20). The National Cattle Health Declaration must be signed by the owner or the person responsible for the cattle. In addition, exhibitors must provide certification that animals entered for competition in all cattle classes, including calves at foot, have been tested for Pesti-virus and certified as non PI (Persistently Infected). Certification must be provided in the form of a laboratory report or signed Veterinary Certificate, listing animals with their individual identification. **NO ANIMALS** are to be unloaded without relevant Health Documentation.

Animals previously tested and certified as non PI are not required to be retested, however certification must be provided. The National Cattle Health Declaration (V:

16/04/20) and non-PI certification must be submitted on entry

STOCK MOVEMENT AND IDENTIFICATION

All stock must comply with NSW legislation in relation to animal movements and stock identification. Any stock found in breach of these requirements may be excluded from competition and requested to leave the grounds. Any costs relating to a breach issue are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

PRIZES AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an exhibit as part.

RULES & REGULATIONS

AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH OF EXHIBITS

1 March 2026 is the reference date for the calculation of age of an animal for the purposes of entering age classes in the beef cattle competitions.

Please Note: Dates of birth for classes restricted by age: (relative to Royal Canberra Show dates):-

AGE OF EXHIBITORS

Persons under the age of 14 years will not be permitted to lead animals (other than in junior events) except at the discretion of the Chief Ring Steward.

ANIMALS THAT ARE NOT ENTIRE

A male animal shall not be eligible for exhibition, except in Steer Classes, if it is not entire. All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY.

An exhibit may only compete in the class in which it is entered. Information as requested on the application for entry must be completed otherwise the application will not be accepted. All entries are exhibited at the exhibitors own risk.

LATE ENTRIES

No entries accepted after 9 February 2026

SUBSTITUTIONS

No substitutions will be accepted unless prior approval, in writing, is provided by Chief Cattle Steward.

WITHDRAWALS

- a) Exhibitors who subsequently are unable to exhibit and who advise the Society in writing by no later than 9 February will be provided with a refund.
- b) No refund will be offered for any withdrawal made after 14-February except for:
 - a. the death of the exhibit;
 - b. the exhibit is unfit by way of injury or ill health as certified by a veterinary surgeon (a certificate must be provided); or
 - c. any other reason satisfactory to the Cattle Committee or its representative;

CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW

It is agreed between the parties that if at the discretion of the Directors or Chief Executive Officer or other authorised officer of the RNCAS, that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the exhibitor shall not pursue the society for the recovery of lost income or damages.

It is acknowledged by the exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such legal action.

BEDDING

One bale of straw bedding will be provided with each animal entry. Fodder and additional bedding will be available for purchase on the ground during the show.

BREED REPRESENTATIVE

The RNCAS Cattle Committee will nominate a representative of each breed who will assist with responsibilities stated below.

Final approval and appointment of all Officials for the Canberra Royal Cattle Show is at the discretion of the Cattle Committee.

Representative responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Act as conduit for communication between Exhibitors (for the specific breed) and the Cattle Committee at the Show and throughout the year;
- Be an Exhibitor in the breed for the nominated Show;
- Assist with Inspections of Exhibits for the specific breed at the Show, stepping aside when inspecting their own Exhibits;
- Be responsible for the conduct and parading of the Exhibits of that breed as directed by the Chief Cattle Steward;
- Agree to be bound by the Conditions and Guidelines for Cattle Show Officials.

BREEDERS GROUP ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Exhibits in the breeders group must be owned and bred by the exhibitor and drawn from competitive classes and consist of two bulls and one female, or vice versa. Winner of this class is eligible for interbreed classes excluding Small/Rare breeds.

SIRE'S OR DAM'S PROGENY CLASS ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Two animals any age by one Dam must be bred and owned by one exhibitor. Progeny only to be shown.

CALVES AT FOOT

Calves at foot in Cow classes must be no more than 9 months old at the time of the Royal Canberra Show, calves must be registered and/or proof of registration is required.

CLEANING OF STALLS, FEEDING

Each exhibitor shall be responsible for the removal of all manure from the stall in which their exhibit is stalled. In case of a breach of this provision, the Society may affect the removal of all material, and the exhibitor shall contribute to the Society \$100 per stall, per day towards the cost of such removal.

An exhibit not fed and/or watered either by the exhibitor or their agent, will be fed and/or watered by the Society and a fine of \$500 plus costs will be charged to the exhibitor and/or their representative.

DOG MANAGEMENT POLICY

NO DOGS ALLOWED. If you bring a dog, you will be asked to leave. Your entries will be cancelled and there will be NO refund given.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

Passes will be issued as follows:

- 1-3 head 2 passes
- 4-5 head 3 passes
- 6 or more head 4 passes

Pre-purchased additional passes can be purchased online at time of entry at a cost of \$60 per pass (3 day pass)

FIREWORKS

A fireworks display will be held on Friday and Saturday night. Please ensure your animals are correctly attended to during this period.

GRAND PARADE

It is the condition of entry into the Royal Canberra Show that every broad ribbon winner is required to take part in the Grand Parade on the Arena at the times set out in the catalogue. Failure to participate in the Grand Parade will entail a penalty of \$100 (per exhibit), forfeiture of prize money, awards, and/or non-acceptance at any subsequent Royal Canberra Shows.

Breed approved attire MUST be worn in the Grand Parades. Suitable footwear, ie hard covered boots must be worn, not permitted are gym shoes, runners, thongs, open sandals or high heels.

GRANDSTANDS AND SEATING ACCOMMODATION

Persons occupying grandstands or other seating accommodation on the Showground do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Society in respect of any loss or injury by reason of any defect or accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Council or an employee or agent of the Society, or on the part of any other person.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

Any animal infected by ringworm or warts will be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show excluding animals who have been treated with a current vet certificate stating they are cleared to attend the show. The Inspectors shall report any animal that they believe to be infected by ringworm or warts to inspect such animal for the purpose of determining whether the animal is so infected.

Without prejudice to the General Regulations, the determinations of the Inspectors or of a Veterinary matter shall be subject only to appeal to the Chief Steward who will make a determination in regards to these matters. Such determinations and directions shall be final and may not be called into question in any manner or in any proceedings whatsoever.

Cattle from any State or Territory of the Commonwealth of Australia are eligible for entry provided they are not subject to quarantine or restriction with respect to Footand-mouth disease (FMD), Bovine Johne's Disease (BJD) or any other notifiable disease. Upon receipt of each entry the Society may request the Veterinary Officer of the State or Territory of origin of the exhibit to certify from existing records that the exhibit is not subject to quarantine or restriction with respect to Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), Bovine Johne's Disease (BJD) or any other notifiable disease. The certificate from a Veterinary Office shall be conclusive evidence of the facts contained therein.

INSPECTIONS

Each Breed shall have a representative attend inspections.

Each animal will be subject to identification and inspection by the Inspector appointed by the RNCAS. Inspections of all cattle will commence at times to be determined by the Cattle Committee.

Exhibitors are required to have their stock attended and clean in readiness for inspection at the time specified on the relevant day.

The Inspectors, Chief Steward or their assistants will not be required to furnish to the exhibitor any reasons for their determinations or directions, or to give the exhibitor any right to be heard on any matter in question.

Without prejudice to any other applicable rules, the Cattle Committee may determine that an exhibit will not be accepted for exhibition due to any of the following reasons:

- The exhibit is not considered of sufficient merit to be exhibited.
- The exhibit has not been adequately prepared.
- The exhibit bears any marking brand or tattoos inconsistent with the marking, brand or tattoos disclosed on the relevant entry form or Breed Society records or whose tattoo is not clearly legible.
- Any exhibit under 18 mths must not show evidence of a permanent tooth.
- Any exhibit entered in an under 24 mths class must not show evidence of more than two permanent teeth.
- Where possible calf at foot, born prior to entry to the Showground is to be tattooed if required by breed society regulations.
- Calves at foot must be no older than 9 months on judging day.
- All females must be exhibited with a nose clip or ring.
- Any dispute regarding the age of an exhibit shall be adjudicated by the Society and on inspection of the exhibit in question, his decision shall be final and not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

All exhibits must comply with the Property Identification Code (PIC) and National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) legislation of NSW. Exhibits not appropriately identified by means of an electronic identification will be deemed ineligible. Property Identification Code must be provided at the time of entry.

WEIGHING & MOUTHING

All bulls entered in the Beef Section of the Royal Canberra Show will be, prior to the judging, weighed and weights will be displayed for the Judge's identification.

It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that his/her entry has been weighed prior to judging.

INTRACTABLE ANIMALS

If at its absolute discretion, the Society determines any exhibit or exhibits of stock to be dangerous for any reason whatsoever, the Society may by notice to the exhibitor, require the exhibit concerned to be removed from the Showground. The exhibitor upon receipt of such notice shall remove such animal.

JUDGING

The Society may change the Judge for any particular class, at any time, if it deems fit. Breed judging will be conducted by a single judge system.

No exhibit shall receive an award, if in the opinion of the Judge, it is unworthy of such award.

Exhibits shall be present at the appropriate judging ring and ready to enter the judging ring at the time specified for the event to take place. Exhibits shall enter the judging ring immediately upon request by the appropriate Steward. Persons in charge of exhibits must under no circumstances leave their exhibits unattended, at or in the judging ring.

No competitor or exhibitor or person acting on behalf of any competitor or exhibitor shall in any way influence, consult or interfere with or attempt to influence, consult or interfere with the Judge or endeavour to interfere with his freedom of choice or judgement.

The decision of the Judge as to the merits of the exhibit and the competitor, shall be final and binding, whether or not such decision was made or purported to be made in accordance with these or any other relevant regulations, and no appeal may be made or order for review or similar order sought there from to any court of law or other body on the question of merit of the exhibit, or on any matter arising out of or in connection with the manner in which the Judge's decision was made, or purported to be made or otherwise.

Subject to the Regulations in the relevant schedule, the Judge may award a second or third prize instead of a first prize, or may withhold a prize altogether where he considers in his absolute discretion, that such prize not be awarded.

Subject to the Regulations in the schedule, should there be a tie for any placing in any event or class, subsequent placings in that event or class will be awarded such that the next placing will be the sum of the number of exhibits already placed plus one. (For example, if two exhibits tie for first place, the next placing to be awarded is third).

PARADES AND ATTIRE

Unless otherwise directed, an attendant of an exhibit (or breed sign carrier) whilst parading such exhibit either before a Judge or in the Grand Parade, shall wear a clean, approved breed approved attire. Suitable footwear, i.e. hard covered boots must be worn, not permitted is gym shoes, runners, thongs, open sandals or high heels.

PERSON IN CHARGE OF AN ANIMAL

The Owner or his/her representative is responsible for the animal's care and well-being for the duration of the Show.

PRIZE MONEY

All prize money is GST inclusive.

PUREBRED

Exhibits in the beef breed and dairy classes must conform to the rules and regulations of the Breed Society with which they are registered, before being eligible for exhibition and/or to gain an award. All exhibits to be the progeny of registered sire and dam of the same breed.

RECOGNISED BREED SOCIETY

The exhibit must have been fully accepted for registration by a recognised Cattle Breed Society, and proof of registration and ownership must accompany the application for entry. An entire copy (both sides if applicable) of the registration certificate must be provided.

RESTRICTION OF ENTRIES

If total entries are more than the number of cattle capable of being stalled, the Society reserves the right to request intending exhibitors to reduce the number of animals entered. Total stud animals will be restricted to 370 head including calves at foot.

RIBBONS

Prize ribbons may be awarded throughout the Cattle Section to 5th place. Supreme Champion of the Breed Ribbon will only be awarded where both sexes are represented.

SECURITY OF ANIMALS - NOSE RINGS, HALTERS, LEADS AND RUGS

All Cattle must be effectively trained to lead.

All Cattle must be restrained in the following manner.

- a) When stalled: Each animal will be securely tied up by an effective neck rope or collar plus head halter.
- b) At any other time: Minimum head halter with lead rope and nose grip with suitable lead rope.

MALES

- a) Under nine months of age will be restrained by a halter and suitable lead rope.
- b) Over nine months of age will be restrained by a nose ring attached to a suitable lead rope and also wear a suitable halter with its own lead rope attached.

FEMALES

- a) Under nine months of age will be restrained by a halter attached to a suitable lead rope.
- b) Over nine months of age will be restrained by a nose grip attached to a suitable lead rope and also wear a suitable halter with its own lead rope attached.

ATTENDANTS

All people restraining cattle shall be effectively trained and be able to do so.

Please note - modifications of, or additions to tie up facilities must be approved the chief cattle steward

STALLS

An exhibit may not be stalled in any other stall than the one allocated by the Society to the exhibitor. A calf must be stalled with its mother and though tethered, must have unrestricted access to her at all times.

GROOMING FRAMES

Exhibitors who have applied for allocation of space and paid the \$40 fee will be permitted to bring a grooming frame onto the Showground. The use of powered washers is prohibited.

TAMPERING OF EXHIBITS

No exhibitor shall be permitted to exhibit any cattle, which in the opinion of the Society, displays evidence of being tampered with or, in the definition of the class in which it is entered, an animal entered for exhibition or competition is not presented in its natural conformation and has no preparation other than normal feeding and fitting with the exception of normal dressing of hair, hoofs and horns.

The following practices are strictly prohibited:

- a) An operation or any kind of surgery materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body.
- b) The infusion or injection of any drugs or any other substance or the insertion of any object into the teats, blood vessels, muscles or under the skin of any animal to restrict the flow of milk or alter its natural physical attributes.
- c) The setting of the teats of an animal with any form of glue or other setting substance or any other action which alters the natural teat placement of an animal.
- d) Evidence of such practices renders an exhibit liable to instant disqualification and the Exhibitor or/his/her agent liable to a suspension range from 5 years to lifetime.

e) It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure the animal is not subject to prohibited practices, prior to and whilst on the Showground.

The Society may make or cause to be made, any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or other substance has been administered to the exhibit and may take possession of any such exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such exhibit for such period as the Society deems necessary.

Procedures for the testing of prohibited substances may include random tests on exhibits.

Should a positive test to a prohibited substance or practice result, any costs associated with testing will be borne by the Exhibitor.

TIME OF ARRIVAL

Enter the Showground via Gate 4 the Northbourne Avenue Gate. (near service station)

- Beef Cattle will not be admitted before 10am Wednesday 18 February 2026 and must be on grounds before 12.00pm on Thursday 20 February 2026.
- Commercial Steers & Heifers will not be admitted before 12pm Tuesday 17 February 2026 and must be on grounds by 12pm Wednesday 18 February 2026.

TIME OF DEPARTURE

All cattle are to remain on the Showground until 5.00pm Sunday 23 February 2026 except for Purebred Steers who may leave on completion of Judging until 8pm Thursday 20 February 2026.

Exhibitors travelling the furthest distance will be entitled to leave first.

Exhibitors who reside in VIC, QLD, SA, TAS and WA and or exhibitors who reside more than 400km of Exhibition Park Canberra can seek approval to depart by 7:30am Sunday 22 February 2026. Application is to me made at time of entry.

Any exhibitor found to be leaving earlier than stated will receive a reprimand made by the RNCAS.

PARKING

- Private vehicles other than cattle transport will not be permitted onto the ground.
- Cattle transports are to be parked in the area set aside for that purpose.

STOCK FLOATS

All stock must be unloaded from vehicles as soon as possible on arrival. Once unloaded, the vehicle must leave the Showground and park in an area set aside for that purpose.

Drivers of vehicles carrying stock to or from the Showground must conform to the instructions issued to Exhibitors or their agents.

WHEELBARROWS

Wheelbarrows will be available to exhibitors for use at the Cattle Office.

WORKPLACE HEALTH & SAFETY ACT

Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showground will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers, and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. All electrical leads need to be for outdoor use.

This is essential for the safety of yourself, fellow exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1989.

Smoking is prohibited in the cattle sheds and cattle marquees.

Exhibitors are advised that the use of gas stoves, or any heating or lighting appliances or any naked light, within or in the vicinity of the cattle stalls or cattle marquees, is forbidden.

Camping Rules

All Exhibitors must present a completed NATIONAL VENDOR DECLARATION and a MSA VENDOR DECLARATION from the same property of origin at the Inspections and Weighing on Wednesday 18 February 2026. Failure to present these documents will result in the Exhibit not being processed for the Competition.

All steers must NOT show a more than 2 permanent teeth.

INSPECTIONS

- a) All Exhibits will be inspected for breed type, soundness and constitution.
- b) All inspections will be carried out by Inspectors appointed by the Committee.
- c) All Exhibits must be naturally poll, dehorned or tipped within 3cm of their head. Any tipped horns must be no longer than 3cm at any point around the horn, and horn length will be measured from the hairline (where the skin meets the horn).
- d) All Exhibits that weigh and qualify for the Lightweight Class, must not show any permanent, erupting or protruding teeth at the time of inspection.
- e) All Exhibits that weigh and qualify for the Middleweight and Heavyweight Classes must not show more than two permanent teeth at the time of inspection.
- f) National Vendor Declarations (NVD) and MSA Vendor Declarations must be provided at the time of weighing for each Exhibit.
- g) Any steers that do not meet the minimum live weight requirement of 380kg will be disqualified, and will not be eligible for processing at the abattoir. Steers will only be weighed once, and no steers will be re-weighed.
- h) An Exhibit that has been disqualified by the Inspectors will not be eligible for processing at the abattoir, and may be fined and/or removed from the ground at the discretion of the Committee.
- i) Bulls (entire males) and females will not be accepted for Exhibition.
- j) All steers must have been castrated by the complete removal of testes.
- k) A male cryptorchid or partial castrate will not be accepted for Exhibition, however, if a male cryptorchid or partial castrate is exhibited and slaughtered any extra slaughtering charges are to be borne by the Exhibitor. The Exhibit will be disqualified and the Exhibitor asked to show cause why they should not be deemed guilty of Unethical Conduct.

CARCASE JUDGING METHOD

The National Capital Trade Steer & Heifer Hoof Competition will be judged at on Thursday 20 February 2026 followed by the National Capital Led Steer & Heifer Competition. The Competition is open to all Cattle, purebred or crossbred

Carcases will be judged using the Australian Beef Carcase Appraisal Method (ABCAM 4.3), awarding points for meeting market specifications (20 points), yield of saleable meat (40 points) and eating quality (40 points). Carcases will be judged as to their suitability for the domestic and export trade in high quality carcases and primal cuts.

Carcases will be judged against the fat specifications. Weight penalty points will be applied to carcases dressing under 180kg (at a rate of one carcase point per kg under 180kg) as these are considered to have limited market suitability.

Weight penalty points will be applied to carcases dressing over 440kg (at the rate of one carcase point per kg over 440kg) as these are considered to have limited market suitability.
